Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

The Opening Dialogue ("The Lord be with you . . .") may be sung or spoken.

Great and holy God, we give you thanks
for each and every perfect gift that you have given.
It is you who created the whole world and everything in it.
We marvel at your handiwork
and are in awe of your presence
for you created humanity out of the dust and called us good.
You claimed a people as your own
and led them from enslavement to the Promised Land.
Even though we have turned away,
you never turned away from us.
You continue to lead us in the way of life everlasting.

Therefore, we sing with all the heavenly host:

The Sanctus ("Holy, holy, holy Lord . . .") may be sung or spoken.

We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Savior.
He came to earth as your incarnate Son,
teaching us the way of your Kingdom.
Jesus lived a life like ours but was without sin.

He healed the sick, comforted the lowly
and challenged unjust structures.
Although he died on the cross,
we rejoice at his resurrection and ascension
that we may experience new life.

The words of institution are spoken here, if not elsewhere.

We give you thanks, O Lord, that on the night of his arrest,
Jesus took the loaf of bread, blessed and broke it, saying:
“This is my body, which is broken for you.
Eat this in remembrance of me.”

We also give you thanks that on the same night,
Jesus took the cup, saying:
“This cup is the new covenant,
sealed in my blood for the forgiveness of sin.
As often as you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.”

Remembering Jesus, we break this bread and share this cup.
May we offer our lives in joyful service until he comes again.

The memorial acclamation may be sung or spoken.

Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again.

We give you thanks, O God, for the Holy Spirit.
May your Spirit be poured out on these gifts of bread and wine
so that we may be nourished and filled with your presence.
Let our lives be gifts to you, and send us out with hope
that we may be one with our neighbors, friends and loved ones
as the body of Christ in service to the world.

All blessing, honor and power
are yours, O Lord, now and forever. **Amen.**
